# Coast Area Waste

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## What is Waste

- Merchantable Crown timber, whether standing or felled, that remains on site upon the completion of primary logging.
- Waste surveys are the process to assess the volume of waste.
  - Carried out by licensees
  - Ministry conducts field verifications ~ 5%

# **Types of Waste**

- Unavoidable or Avoidable
- Dispersed or Accumulations

## **Waste Includes**


- Standing Timber
  - Breakage
- Logs, Portions of Logs and slabs

- High stumps
- Bucking waste
- Abandoned decked timber


## **Waste Levels**


- Waste levels in Coast Area have risen over the last decade:
  - Ave. avoidable waste (monetary billing) ~ 110 m³/ha
  - Waste accounts for ~2.6 mil cubic m³/year,
     or about 1 m³ for every 4.25 m³ cut and removed
- In general, levels of waste vary depending upon location and harvest method:
  - Remote sites = Higher waste.
  - Helicopter logging operations = Higher waste.
  - Higher cost logging/transportation = Higher waste.

#### COAST AREA - 2012 - 2017





### Coast Area Waste Summary 2012 to 2017
